Foremost on my mind is the possibility of losing the snake river hydro dams. As this generation is the most reliable and cost-effective form of generating electricity for you; our members. This past January proved that these dams are crucial to not only GEC, but the entire Northwest, as Bonneville Power hit a record 11,396 MW of demand and we had no blackouts. These hydro dams keep our electricity reliable and low-cost generation, and it is renewable. As we move forward with electrifying America, these will become even more important. I encourage every member to contact their state and federal elected officials and let them know we need to save these dams.

The continued training and demonstrations at our schools and our local EMT's, Police and Fire departments is so important. We have 12 days a year that refresh our employees on First Aid, CPR and the use of all safety equipment and procedures and OSHA requirements. A true measure of our commitment to our employees who work hard to keep the lights on and our communities safe from the dangers of downed lines.

OPERATIONS REPORT MIKE PYETTE-OPERATIONS MANAGER

Glacier Electric crews were busy adding 62 new services. Crews were also busy installing new poles and equipment to help limit and prevent outages, improve reliability, system coordination, and improve switching procedures. This spring and summer we will continue upgrades on our three substations.

Browning City Substation- The crews will be adding another 7.2/1247 kW bay to split load in and around the immediate Browning area.

Babb Substation- Glacier Electric will be changing out three of the existing substation transformers with a more efficient lower profile pad mounted unit.

Blackfoot Substation- Additional equipment will be added to enhance the switching procedures, which in turn enhances safety, reliability, and replaces outdated deteriorating equipment.
